





U.S. Worker Availability Ratio


The number of available workers for each job opening in the United States

More Openings, Fewer Available Workers









Birth rate (births/1,000 population)





The birth rate is usually the dominant factor in determining the rate of population growth. It depends on both the level of fertility and the age structure of the population.







Rate at which individuals assimilate new technology


Rate of introduction of new technology






